

IN CONNECTION WITH ANY ACTUAL OR POSSIBLE CONFLICT OF INTEREST, ALL EMPLOYEES ACKNOWLEDGE THAT THEY MUST DISCLOSE THE EXISTENCE OF A FINANCIAL INTEREST AND BE GIVEN THE OPPORTUNITY TO DISCLOSE ALL MATERIAL FACTS TO THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND/OR THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS (AS APPLICABLE), PRIOR TO CONSIDERING A PROPOSED FINANCIAL TRANSACTION OR ARRANGEMENT.

A CONFLICT OF INTEREST ARISES WHEN A PERSON IN A POSITION OF AUTHORITY OVER AN ORGANIZATION, SUCH AS A BOARD MEMBER OR EMPLOYEE, MAY BENEFIT FINANCIALLY FROM A DECISION HE OR SHE COULD MAKE IN SUCH CAPACITY, INCLUDING INDIRECT BENEFITS TO FAMILY MEMBERS OR BUSINESSES WITH WHICH THE PERSON IS CLOSELY ASSOCIATED. OTHER SITUATIONS MAY CREATE THE APPEARANCE OF A CONFLICT, OR PRESENT A DUALITY OF INTERESTS IN CONNECTION WITH A PERSON WHO HAS INFLUENCE OVER THE ACTIVITIES OR FINANCES OF THE ORGANIZATION. FOR PURPOSES OF THIS POLICY, THE FOLLOWING CIRCUMSTANCES SHALL BE DEEMED TO CREATE A CONFLICT OF INTEREST:

AN EMPLOYEE (INCLUDING A FAMILY MEMBER OF THE EMPLOYEE) IS A PARTY TO A CONTRACT, OR INVOLVED IN A TRANSACTION WITH CORAL FOR GOODS OR SERVICES.

MINUTES OF THE DELIBERATIONS OF THE FINANCE/AUDIT COMMITTEE REGARDING COMPENSATION REVIEW SHALL BE RECORDED AND MAINTAINED IN THE ORGANIZATION'S CORPORATE RECORDS.
